Program Description

Purposes and goals of the program: To educate Americans and Chinese who aim to function professionally in English and Chinese

Type of program: Customized Chinese classes and group classes with many different options - immersion, partial immersion, bilingual, foreign language, content-based, exploratory, before or after school, or Saturday academy. The interpreters program is a California court certified program.

Program origin: It was founded in 2001 by an individual.

Staff

Instructors' and administration's expectations for the program: To help students to learn Chinese language and culture, and to allow certain students to be able to translate and interpret professionally

Students

Students: 10% of students are first-generation immigrants, 20%, second-generation immigrants, and 70% are students with non-ethnic background. Students are from the United States, China, Taiwan, and Hong Kong.

How the program identifies heritage speakers: We are open to everyone.

Possible reasons for student withdrawal: Change of work or financial conditions.

Instructors

Number of instructors in the program: 12

Languages in which instructors are proficient: They are native speakers of Chinese, Mandarin, and Cantonese.

Proficiency level: They are native speakers.

Credentials: 30% of the teaching staff hold a teacher's certificate or license in teaching Chinese in California. Some teachers have a BA, and others have an MA in Education.

Instruction

Total contact hours per week: Once or twice for a total of 3 hours per week.

Student grouping: They are grouped by level.

Language skills

Heritage language skills: Listening, speaking, reading, and writing

English skills: Listening, speaking, reading, and writing

Culture

Aspects of culture taught: History, festivals, customs, traditions/beliefs, religion, folktales, social and cultural norms, cultural appropriateness, and literature
