Suffixes



SUFFIXES

Suffixes are letters that come after the main part, or root of a word.

Suffixes often change the part of speech of the word. For example, when you add the suffix -**er** to the verb read, you get the noun reader. When you add to suffix -**or** to the verb act, you get the noun actor.

You add the suffix -ist to nouns, so -ist doesn't change the part of speech, but like -er and -or, it is a 'person word.' It lets you know that the word means someone that does the activity in the first part of the word.

A reader is someone who reads, an actor is someone who acts, and an artist is someone who makes art!
