**Possible reasons for student withdrawal:** Other classes conflict with the schedule or students lose interest.

Students' attitudes toward the language varieties they speak: The program is designed to teach them greater tolerance for other varieties of Spanish.

Languages in which instructors are proficient: Spanish. Six of the seven teachers are native speakers of Spanish.
