This interview protocol is to be used for students who were not initially identified as SLIFE; however, have demonstrated or stated gaps in their formal education in the course of the school year. This protocol should be conducted with the parent of the student in their native language (including with an interpreter, if necessary). For older students who may be unaccompanied minors, please reach out to the Office of English Learners (OEL) for additional guidance.
